The Forest Service is developing a proposed action for a landscape level analysis - the Central Tongass Landscape Level Analysis (CTLLA). The project area includes both the Petersburg and Wrangell Ranger Districts on the Tongass National Forest. Through the National Environmental Policy Act process, we plan to identify and analyze the environmental effects of a variety of activities that can be implemented over the next 10 to 15 years.
