

NOTICE OF AVAILABILITY
DRAFT ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT FOR
PROPOSED SHIPBREAKING OF TWO EX-COAST GUARD ISLAND
CLASS CUTTERS AT US COAST GUARD BASE KETCHIKAN, ALASKA

The US Coast Guard (USCG) has completed a draft Environmental Assessment (EA) for a proposal to dispose of the hulls of ex-Coast Guard Cutter (CGC) FARALLON (WPB 1301) and ex-CGC SAPELO (WPB 1314) – 110-foot Island Class Cutters – currently positioned at Coast Guard Base Ketchikan per the requirements of the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA); Council on Environmental Quality Regulations (40 CFR Parts 1500-1508); Department of Homeland Security Management Directive 023-01; and Coast Guard Commandant Instruction (COMDTINST) M16475.1D, *National Environmental Policy Act Implementing Procedures and Policy for Considering Environmental Impacts*. The USCG proposes a one-time tow of the cutters to a licensed and permitted facility to demolish (or *shipbreak*) the hulls and dispose of the scrap property in a permitted procedure.

The ex-CGC FARALLON and ex-CGC SAPELO are currently moored on the inside face of the floating pier located at the southern end of the base. The cutters have already been stripped of major equipment, paneling, insulation, and wiring. All component tanks have been cleaned of fuel, oil, wastewater, and black water. The USCG intends to have the cutters towed to a reginal, permitted facility, and scrapped through crushing, smashing, shearing, cutting, breaking, melting, burning, slashing, or other effective means that would render materials incapable of restoration, rehabilitation, or re-manufacture as an item usable for its originally intended purpose before turn-in to any disposal facility or activity. The USCG proposes to have the cutters towed from Base Ketchikan to a regionally located scrapping facility. The USCG would coordinate with the Southeast Alaska Pilots’ Association and publish and broadcast Notices to Mariners for the one-time tow event.

This Draft EA serves as a concise public document that provides evidence and analysis for determining whether a FONSI is appropriate or an Environmental Impact Statement should be prepared. The EA presents the purpose and need for the action, the proposed action and alternatives, a description of the affected environment, and an analysis of environmental consequences. The EA also documents cumulative impacts from projects which are proposed, under construction, recently completed, or anticipated to be implemented in the near future.
