Notice is hereby given that the Petersburg Indian Association will receive sealed bids for the 12TH, HOWKAN, 13TH STREET SIDEWALK PROJECT. The project generally consist of the construction for sidewalks and storm water sewers along 12th Street, Howkan Street and 13th Street in Petersburg, Alaska. The project will be in three parts: base bid, additive item #1 & additive item #2. The bid will be awarded with base bid alone or base bid with a combination of additive bid items, either item or both. Base bid is approximately 1040 linear feet of sidewalk, with approximately 710 linear feet of storm water sewer. Additive bid item #1 is approximately 555 linear feet of sidewalk, with approximately 540 linear feet of storm water sewer. Additive bid item #2 is approximately 330 linear feet of sidewalk, with approximately 200 linear feet of storm water sewer. The estimated construction cost for the base bid is between \$400,000 & \$500,000. All Work must be completed by October 15, 2020.

Pursuant to Petersburg Borough Charter Section 13.02, the Petersburg Borough publishes the following notice:

At the October 1, 2019 municipal election, a proposition will be on the ballot to borrow up to \$8 million for Water and Wastewater infrastructure projects. The indebt-edness would be the obligation of the water and wastewater only, and be paid from utility revenues. The indebtedness will be incurred by application for separate, project-specific loans to be issued through the Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation (ADEC) municipal loan program, each application separately approved by the Assembly, with terms not to exceed 20 years and a current annual interest rate of approximately 1.5%. The annual debt service payment will be dependent on the loan amount and term.
