And when they had seen it, they made known abroad the saying which was told them concerning this child.


And all they that heard it wondered at those things which were told them by the shepherds.

Lighting up the town



The winter solstice is the longest night of the year. It generally comes around December 21st, though the exact moment, sometimes even the day, changes. Marking the moment, the spirit of it, is a common human theme. Something about staring into the dark and, to get through, reaching

It was when the Romans celebrated Saturnalia, the giftgiving holiday honoring the god Saturn. In ancient Persia now continued in Iran. neighboring countries, and Kurdish communities families enjoy Yaldā Night, or Chelle Night with special foods, poetry and staying awake until dawn to celebrate the victory of light over dark. Old Norse solstice traditions included lighting fires to keep away spirits in the dark nights. The Dongzhi Festival is the Winter Solstice celebration in China, when families gather over special meals and the hope of spring. Learning about the world's traditions is part of the day's magic for me. A reminder of how many things we have in common.

This year the exact moment of winter solstice is Tuesday, December 21st, at around 7 am. In the past I've spent the with a boisterous dav gathering of friends and family, alone with a candle and tea, or in a small circle around a fire. As I write this, all I know about my plans for that day are that I would like to spend time with people I love thinking about what a miracle it is. To be here. Now.

And all of it is because of something called axial tilt. The way our planet spins in relation to the sun, which is

around 23.4 degrees. As Sasha Sagan reminds in her book 'For Creatures Such as We,' it's the reason we have seasons at all. It is part of the story of how we are even here. Seasons the habitable create temperatures that set the biological foundations of life.

My partner Bryan, an astronomy enthusiast, and I are reading Sagan's book together. When we got to the chapter that mentioned Earth's axial tilt he told me that in winter, we in the northern hemisphere are actually closer to the sun than we are in summer. It's the angle that gives us the colder weather, not our distance, because the direct sunlight makes all the difference.


He told me that it's actually a topic of debate about why we have that special tilt. That it could be because when the planet was being formed it collided with debris that became our moon, or some other possibility we don't have the evidence to begin considering yet. The exact degree of the tilt wobbles, Bryan told me, so even that changes

Whatever the reason, and vhatever makes it possible, it is my favorite day. Maybe it's the stubborn side of me, finding joy even in a single candle surrounded by the dark.

Pastor Matthew Rich (in A Week from Next Tuesday) tells the story of a little girl who was undergoing the standardized test to assess readiness for kindergarten. The teacher soon reported to the anxious parents that the child was certainly well-prepared to begin school. But she added, "I also want to share with you the answer she gave to one of the questions. I asked your daughter, 'If you are going into a room that is dark, what should you do?' The only acceptable answer according to the test is 'turn on the light.' However, your daughter said, 'If I was going into a room that is dark, I would hold hands.' I can't give her credit for a correct answer, but I think it is the truest answer I've ever heard.

Friends, as Christmas 2021 approaches, we are surrounded by a world of darkness, both literal and figurative. Some of us feel it only as general anxiety. Others know the darkness of illness, pain, treatment that seems worse than the disease, or a recovery taking too long. To an unwed mother, in the midst of a stable full of animals, into a world that didn't need another king, God steps down from glorious divinity, and offers us a hand to hold-the sure and certain grasp of a tiny human baby, and an eternal, perfect Savior. May we each, in simple child-like faith, gratefully receive that divine embrace.



How to reduce risk of home fires this holiday season

Safety might not be the first thing people think of as the holiday season approaches. Faith, celebrations, decorations, and holiday dinners all come to mind when considering the holiday season. But that doesn't mean safety should be left out of holiday planning.

Fire safety bears special consideration during the holiday season, when the prevalence of fire hazards like Christmas trees, holiday lighting displays and other decorative items increase the risk for home fires. Such tragedies can be averted with a few simple safety measures.

 Tend to your tree. Live Christmas trees are awe-inspiring, but they also pose a significant fire risk. The National Fire Protection Association urges celebrants to choose only healthy trees with fresh, green needles that do not fall off when touched. Such trees are less likely to dry out, especially when well-watered throughout the season. Dry trees can catch fire more easily than healthy trees if embers from nearby fire



 Recognize that location matters when decorating. The NFPA notes that Christmas trees should always be placed at least three feet away from any heat source, including fireplaces, space heaters, heat vents, candles, and even overhead lights. If decorating with candles, never place them on the tree or on tables where other flammable decorations have already been placed. Chanukah menorahs should never be placed near curtains or other decorations.

 Turn off all lights and extinguish all lit decorative items when leaving the home or going to bed. Lit candles and menorahs should never be left unattended. The NFPA recommends turning tree lights and exterior decorative lights off when leaving the home or going to bed. • Utilize a fire screen on fireplaces. Embers can catch on trees, decorations or anything

rees, decorations or anything else that's flammable if they escape the fireplace. Fire screens prevent that from happening by ensuring embers from burning logs stay in the fireplace. Like candles and menorahs, fires burning in a fireplace should never be left unattended. Make sure all embers have been extinguished before leaving the home or going to bed.

 Keep discarded trees away from your home. A 2014 analysis from the NFPA found that none of the ten days with the largest share of Christmas tree fires were before Christmas. Dried out trees still pose a fire risk even after they've been removed from a home. When discarding a tree at the end of the holiday season, place it at the curb or keep it a safe distance away from your home and garage until you can.

the communication vehicles of choice during the era of social distancing. Different applications and services continue to evolve and help people stay in touch. Plan regular chats, either once or twice per week with isolated or vulnerable people. Try to organize a large group chat on the holiday itself so no one has to spend Christmas or Chanukah alone.

 Drop off supplies. Even though supermarket shop-fromhome and other delivery services have normalized somewhat since the start of the pandemic, treat individuals who may be isolated to some personalized attention. Put together care packages of supplies or holiday treats and deliver them in person so you can see the smiles that result

f from being able to visit with someone familiar. - Send uplifting messages. Children or even adults can

Children or even adults can make personalized cards and mail them to loved ones at home or those who may be in longterm care facilities. Send new mailings every week or two so that residents always have something to look forward to in the mail.

 Start a virtual club. A book club or another shared interest can be the catalyst for more frequent communication. A club puts everyone on the same page and enables them to come together, via phone or video chat, for a discussion.

 Ask for help learning a new skill. Along the same vein as a virtual club, lessons on everything from woodworking to crochet to making favorite holiday recipes can be conducted online. Give an isolated individual daily purpose and distraction by engaging him or her with online lessons.

Isolation and feelings of loneliness can affect anyone who normally suffers from cabin fever. However, this year it may be more pronounced, as it could be coupled with social distancing precautions that have already been in effect for some time.


