









Our local traditions are bricks that help build our wonderful community identity. At Christmastime they are all those things we love about the holiday that make people say, " Come on up for Christmas in Petersburg! It's so much fun and there is a tremendous feeling of community everywhere you go! And you go everywhere!" Many of these elements in our common culture have grown up since the town began.

An early newspaper was The Progressive. It reported in on the 1912 Grand Opening of Sons of Norway.

From The Progressive, January 18,1913

On Christmas Day the Sons of Norway opened their spacious new hall to the public with an informal reception and most enjoyable entertainment consisting of moving pictures and a concert by Petersburg's excellent band. The Sons of Norway are to be commended for their up to date home with all modern conveniences, thereby showing a progressive spirit and keeping abreast of the growth of this thriving little city. We join with the public in expressing our appreciation of the addition of such a comfortable social hall for the town and in wishing them the greatest success both socially and financially.

And it is still going on at Sons of Norway at Christmas....julebukking is this Friday from 2 to 4 and everyone is invited.

A later newspaper, The Petersburg Press, reported the first community Christmas Tree. At first electricity in Petersburg was inadequate for such a thing. Whenever a movie was to be shown, the rest of the town had to go

dark. But commercial grade power came in from Crystal Lake in 1924 and the big tree downtown was lighted in

From the Petersburg Press, December 26, 1930

Close to 400 bags of candy and nuts were given away at the first Community Christmas Tree that has ever been staged in Petersburg. The children marched in double file from the school to City Hall where a large tree, obtained by Lloyd T. Swanson and Ed Nelson made an appropriate setting for a program. Mayor Earl Ohmer opened the program with a few remarks. After this many songs were sung by the entire audience, led by Miss Christensen. Immediately after completing the song program the original Santa Claus appeared on the scene, speaking a few words to the anxious crowd of children. After Santa Claus' speech the pushing and pulling and stamping started. Everyone wanted to be the first to talk to Santa Claus. The crowd was kept very orderly by the able assistance of the Petersburg Public School faculty until each and every one had received their Christmas gift. The elaborately lighted Christmas tree which has been put up and lighted by the city will remain until after the holidays.

Later in that decade we have a report on what original julebukking in Petersburg was like. Brought to the community by the Norwegian pioneers, it was mostly in homes until it was embraced by just about everyone, including business owners. This is from a memoir by Justine Gronseth, who grew up on Excel Street in the 1930s, the days of wooden streets. Her father, Chris Gronseth, was the blacksmith who made gaff hooks for the fleet.


Christmas, the most beautiful of seasons is a cherished memory. Dad always found a perfect spruce tree and it had to be trimmed just so. I remember the candles on the tree. Such excitement in seeing them lit! When I was small Santa Claus showed up at the Sons of Norway Hall and at home. Mom baked and cooked for days and the table was loaded with goodies, with emphasis on the Norwegian dishes. It was lutefisk and rommegrot without fail on Christmas Eve. It was the custom to tuck the kids into bed and then the julebukking began. Sometimes it seemed like everyone in town was in our house and Mom and Dad were busy in the kitchen piling up trays of refreshments.


Eleanor Thomassen was young in the 1940s and had a julebukking memory from that era she related in a newspaper interview in the 1980s.


From the Petersburg Press, December 22, 1983

At Christmastime, when it was clear and cold, we went julebukking in the back of a truck. We went from one end to the next end of town. We'd have a drink at each house and we picked up more people on the way and then we'd go dancing. Pickled herring, smoked salmon, dried deer meat, Norwegian cookies and hot drinks and wine kept the julebukkers going. Adults and kids sang carols around the community Christmas Tree. All the kids turned out to see the tree decorated and visit withSanta Claus at the tree.



They will be called Oaks of Righteousness, planted by the LORD to glorify himself. 4 They will rebuild the ancient ruins; they will restore formerly deserted places; they will renew ruined cities, places deserted in generations past... 8I, the LORD, love justice; I hate robbery and dishonesty. I will faithfully give them their wage, and make with them an enduring covenant. 9 Their offspring will be known among the nations, and their descendants among the peoples. All who see them will recognize that they are a people blessed by the LORD. (Isaiah 61:1-4, 8-9 Common English Bible)

Christmas is not merely a cultural celebration. Nor is it limited to a spiritual realm. The message of Christmas includes a mobilization call to change the present world for the better.

Wherever your faith journey might be today, may you have a meaningful Christmas, and may you carry the spirit of Christmas into your interactions this coming year.

more death. I just want to be with Jesus, who has died for me and lives for me. I can't wait to see Him and be with Him forever.







Our Lord Jesus Christ's birth on Earth offers us, even still today, everlasting light and hope in the midst of fears.



The Perfect Time



Evergreen memories

by Chelsea Tremblay This is my daughter Lyra's first winter, so I have been thinking a lot about seasonal traditions. As new parents who are short on time and energy, we focused on our favorite things to celebrate this winter. That meant going to the forest to cut down a tree and cedar greens for windows. The house felt transformed after a single morning out the road yielded a beautiful pine that we covered with multicolored lights, ornaments, and the handmade tree skirt from my childhood.

It left me curious. Where and when did the tradition of evergreens inside a home during winter come from? Why did it feel important to me on a deep level to make sure that, even in a year when time is precious, I carved out enough


Christmas trees are a part of a long history. Evergreens at midwinter festivals were symbolic of the conquering of light over darkness, life over death, in many old traditions. This includes Druids of Ireland, Romans, and Vikings of Scandinavia. It isn't isolated to Europe; ancient Egyptians commemorated the return of the sun god Ra with green palm fronds.

So how, of all the variations, did an evergreen tree inside of a home decorated with lights become so ubiquitous? One story of decorating Christmas trees is associated with Protestant reformer Martin Luther, who according to lore was walking home one night and was struck by stars contrasted against the dark German forest. He was inspired to go home and put candles on his tree to recreate the experience, representing Christ as the light of the world. Then there's Catholic doctrine around Saint Boniface, who in the 8th century

cut down an oak tree that was being used as a pagan symbol for worshiping Thor, and offered a fir tree representing endless life in its stead.

Seemingly the one constant in the history of Christmas trees is dueling theories. According to National Geographic, Latvia and Estonia both claim to be the home of the first town Christmas tree, in either 1510 or 1441 respectively. And the tradition as many practice today, with the tree in a personal home, more likely comes from the Alsace region of now France, then Germany, started during the 16th century. A tree was installed in the Strasbourg Cathedral in 1539. The practice spread throughout Europe by the end of the 18th century.

The tradition only grew as Europeans made their way to North America, despite some resistance. Puritans saw osten-



tatious celebration of the holiday as a desecration that encouraged debauchery and waste. For a time it was illegal to decorate for Christmas in parts of the colonies. Eventually more immigrants from a variety of European regions

ally more immigrants from a variety of European regions continued to make their way across the Atlantic, shifting the dynamics and easing the tight grip of restraint on the season of frivolity.

The royal touch also played a role in influencing public opinion. Queen Charlotte of England, originally from a German territory, is believed to have introduced trees to the British royal family in 1800, but it was an illustration of the popular Queen Victoria and her family dancing around a decorated tree that helped the concept explode among a certain class of citizenry. The sizeable number of German immigrants to North America, over three million between 1840-1880, helped the practice take deeper root.

Those immigrant communities were eventually building the Rockefeller Center in New York City. And in 1931 they pooled money to put up a tree at their worksite, with

ornaments handmade by their families. By 1933 hosting a Christmas tree became a formal practice of the building, and over 125 million people travel to view the tree at Rockefeller Center in all its glory today.

Even fake trees have a longer history than you might expect. Many Germans became worried about deforestation in the late 1800's, and by the 1880's the first known fake trees - made out of goose feathers dyed green, draped over wire - became a widely used option. As technology has shifted, so too has the design of fake trees, and for many the convenience and cleanliness is the preferred way to bring light to the midwinter dark.

But in the end, for me, it's all about the sensory experience of an evergreen. Interestingly enough, it turns out that some of the French background of my family includes the county that contains Alsace. So this might have been a longer family tradition than I could ever have imagined.

Our quick house decorating this year included two framed pictures on the mantle, one of myself and another of my partner, as babies under Christmas trees. In mine I am two years old and completely entranced, gazing in wonder at the mix of shiny, nostalgic, and homemade decorations lining the branches.

This year, a typical morning has included laying my four-month old daughter down in front of the tree, where she happily chatters away while I drink coffee and catch up on the news of the world. In a year when Christmas celebrations in Bethlehem are canceled to mark the violence happening in Palestine, the peace of a quiet morning half a world away sometimes sits like a weight on my heart. So I let the light of the tree fill me with warmth, letting it fuel the inner fire that keeps hope alive in the cold light of day.
